
About us....

Our mission is to assist those children and young people, who have been obstructed to develop and live their life, to realize the change they have always desired for.






### Child Friendly School Programme







# Promoting Young Women in Employment in Pokhara-PYWEP

The project promotes decent work and gender equality in the workplace. The project's target is to provide market-driven vocational training to 740 young women between the age of 18-24 years in the courses such as Hospitality, Trekking Guide, Security Guard, Driver, Computer and Mobile Repair, Electrician and many more chosen by them. The target has been reached. The next step is to ensure their transition to work through job placement and business startup support which is currently ongoing. More than half of them are already in jobs.



Yamkala Thapa, from Syangja district, has a huge responsibility of taking care of her family. She tried a couple of jobs in the past but wasn't paid well in any of the jobs. She was struggling financially when she knew that R4C provides job-skill trainings to young women. She applied for it and was selected. She got enrolled in Security Guard training and successfully completed the training. She now works as a Security Guard in a company and makes a decent earning to support her family. When asked why she choose to be trained as a Security Guard, her response was "The main thing is that I desperately needed a job, but I also feel proud that being a Security Guard, I am challenging the stereotypical mindset that women are supposed to be limited only in certain jobs."





# Promoting and Assisting Girls' Access to Technical Education and Employment- PRAGATEE

PRAGATEE project is all about promoting girls' participation in TVET programs, especially in non-traditional courses and occupations to break gender stereotypes, through career guidance sessions to the secondary level school girls.

In 2022, the project focused on:

- 2-day refresher training for the career guidance facilitators and 20 school teachers.
- 1-day conclusive career guidance session (phase-II) for the students appearing SEE as well as their parents. A total of **359** students (199 girls, 160 boys) and **129** parents participated.





Produced and broadcasted 20 weekly radio episodes "Mero Ichhya, Prabidhik Shikshya" (My Aspiration, Technical Education) to promote female participation in technical education and employment.

The research Women in TVET: Learning from Case Studies in Nepal and the video documentary of successful women in technical occupations-Stories of Success, carried out and produced by the project, were disseminated to more than 2000 people.

Policy workshops were organized with educational stakeholders in each of the 7 provinces emphasizing the need to include technical education in school curriculum and to improve female participation in TVET. A total of 173 stakeholders (from all the 7 provinces) actively participated in the workshops.

#### FAB Hotel School

FAB School is the center that provides a second chance in life to the young people from disadvantaged backgrounds by preparing them for the world of work and connecting them to decent jobs opportunities. FAB School is specialized in providing hospitality training courses such as Production, Service, F&B Housekeeping, Front Office, Bakery, Laundry etc. and helps youth's transition to the labour market, both in the domestic as well as international market.





This year, altogether 169 youth directly benefited from FAB School's different training programmes. FAB School offers short courses of maximum 6-month length and apprenticeship programme of 2-year length. Of the total 169 trainees, 142 received short courses while 27 were enrolled in the long course. Of those who have completed their training programmes, more than 70 percent are in jobs.



The center was established in 2021 during the second wave of the COVID pandemic to provide need-based services to girls and young women (especially 15-25 age groups) working in the entertainment sector in Pokhara.

A total of 523 girls and women have been reached by the project in different ways. Out of this number, 132 benefitted from health awareness sessions provided by certified health workers on various health topics like- family planning, menstrual health and hygiene, UTI, cervical cancer etc.

Similarly, 7 girls were supported for their education including tuition, admission, uniform, stationary supplies etc.



Asha, 20 years old, grew up in a dysfunctional family where daily disputes and fights in the family had taken a toll on her mental health. She started living by her own when she got supported by a foreigner to continue her education. She saw her sister, Mina, in the same condition and wanted to help her come out of that cycle of stress in the family which she had suffered for years. Asha is a student herself and unemployed. She came to She Center requesting for a help to support her sister. Looking at her condition, and her sister's interest in studies, She-Center supported Mina to continue her education. The support includes school fee, tuition, stationary








R4C recently celebrated its 10th anniversary, a decade of dedication and development. Similarly, Promoting Young Women in Employment in Pokhara (PYWEP), implemented in partnership with Plan International Nepal, will come to an end by training up 740 young women in one of the demand-driven occupations and linking them to decent employments. FAB School will continue to provide job skill training and aims to train 200 youth this year. Sports in School will keep on contributing for the holistic development of school children, especially girls, through sports activities. Beyond all these, R4C is very enthusiastic about starting 'PRAYASS' project with the aim to reach out to over 6000 vulnerable girls and young women to protect and prevent them from risks and to improve their future prospects. The SHE Center we started in 2021 will be integrated into this project.

Once again, we are very much thankful to our valued partners and donors for the incessant support which has been crucial in uplifting so many lives. Your endless support and trust will further enable and inspire us to do and achieve more.
